We have also had repairs carried out on the weir where stones and mortar had been washed out. A new dog waste bin has also now been installed near the entrance gate.

Annual General Meeting: The AGM was held in the Village Hall on Tuesday 8 July, although numbers were down slightly on last year. All nominated members were elected unopposed. Our guest speaker was Louise Wainwright. Louise is a Devon County Councillor for the electoral division of Salcombe. We were very grateful to Louise for stepping in at the last minute after Harry Barton had to step down due to an unforeseen family commitment. The title of her talk was 'No Man is an Island'

Louise set up South Devon River Champions in response to increasing evidence of ecological damage to aquatic life that swims lives & breathes in these waters all year round. The chemicals, agricultural pollution and sewage pollution all need to be addressed to restore health to our <u>rivers</u>. Louise was very knowledgeable, she spoke passionately about the work she has been engaged with in South Devon with Community groups looking at issues including micro plastics in the food chain, and how ecologically damaging dog flea treatment. can be to nature, especially in water courses. Our rivers are our responsibility and our behaviour needs to change
