### **Meadow Update**

Thanks to John Severn for, once again, bringing his tractor onto The Island to cut the meadow. This year the central section has been left uncut. This is part of the management plan to leave one area to grow for 2 to 3 years in rotation which allows wild flowers to develop.



Once cut, it's important to rake up the mown grass to prevent it enriching the meadow to the detriment of wild flowers. One Saturday morning in late October the autumn working party, armed with an assortment of rakes, set to work to do just that – and then to put the grass into a small number of mounds around the periphery of the meadow.

There were ten of us this year and other tasks accomplished included stabilising the granite column near the gate, cutting back growth beside the paths all the way around The Island and cleaning signs on the gate. And not forgetting the critical task of providing the industrious team with coffee and biscuits. One major outstanding task is to scallop the bramble growth around the edge of the meadow. This is to stop it encroaching too far and also to create a valuable habitat for wildlife of many sorts — reptiles, mammals, invertebrates, birds. To address this we may decide to hold a second autumn working party or leave it until early next year.
