There is to be a corridor display in the Old School Community Centre during the month of September and then on Saturday 21st we have planned a Fun Day on The Island. AGM Review: There was a good attendance at the Brent Island Trust AGM on Tuesday 25 June. Numbers were up on last year. Kevin Cox, current Chair of RSPB Council, spoke with knowledge and passion on topics ranging from his work in Bolivia in 2008 to establish a protected area for the endangered Blue throated Macaw, to the provision of swift nest boxes in Exeter Cathedral Tower. Kevin also spoke about the work & projects on his own land at Buckfastleigh.

River Avon Viaduct update: Balfour Beatty are continuing their work under the railway viaduct to install scour protection on the bridge piers. The nature of their work involves delivering rocks and



concrete sections to the site. BB will also be carrying out some remedial work on the weir for us, as well as removing the tree trunk next to the bridge. The weir has certainly suffered with the high river levels this Winter and Spring and so we will be very grateful for the work to be carried out.
